



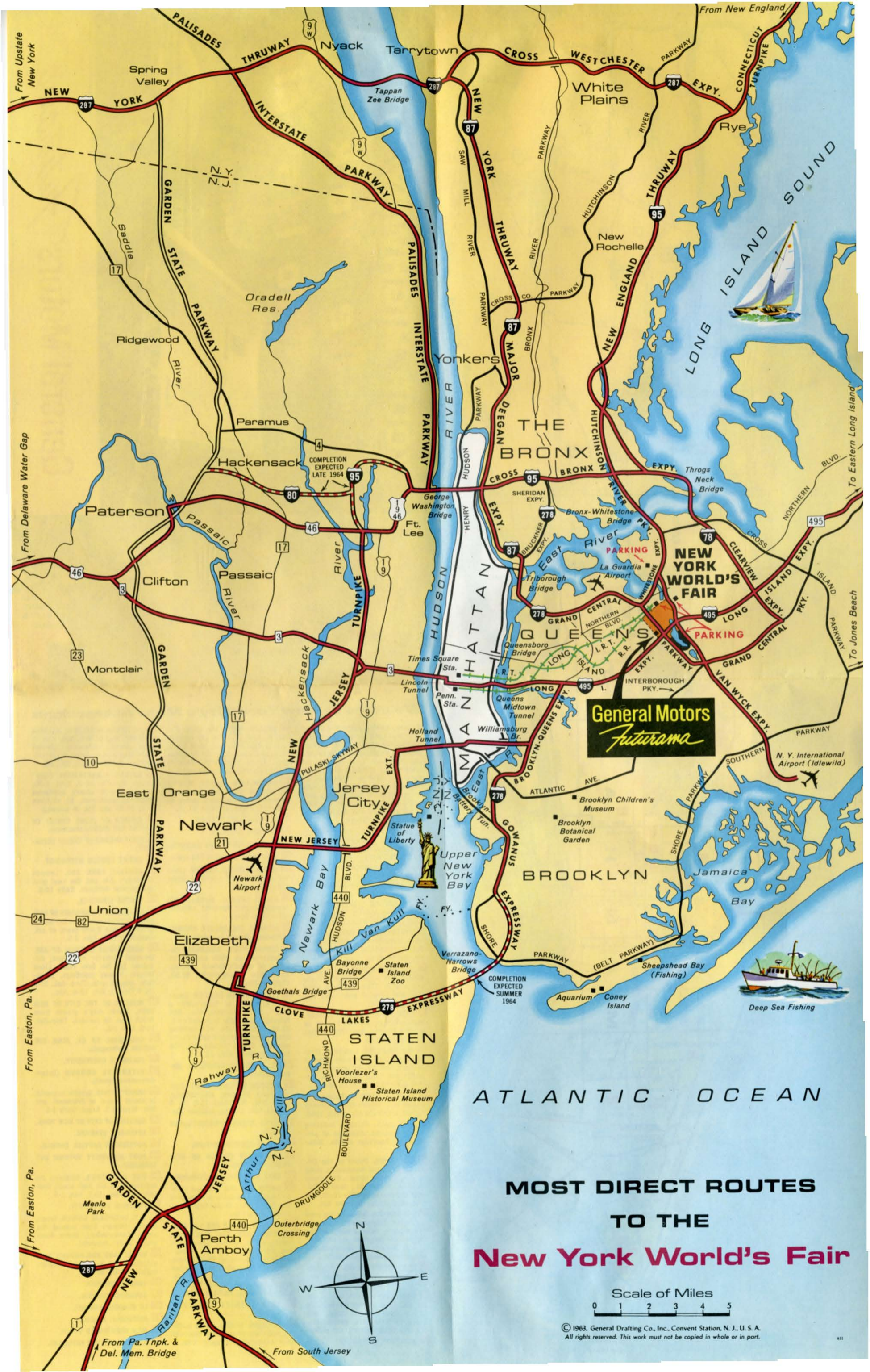
YOUR HIGHWAY GUIDE TO THE **New York** World's Fair 1964-1965

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Welcome to New York City's Many Attractions

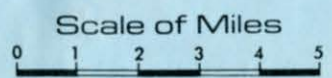
- Become better acquainted with your host—New York—while you're visiting the Fair; the city's pleasures and places offer endless variety. Here are brief sketches of some of the principal attractions. Numbers refer to corresponding numbers on the map on this side. There are many more places indicated on both sides of the map. Admission fees and visiting hours are subject to change.
- 1 BATTERY PARK.** Views of busy harbor from landscaped tract set against skyscraper maze. Site of British fort built in 1693.
 - 2 CASTLE CLINTON NAT. MONUMENT.** Built as fort in 1807, has been an immigration station, theater, aquarium.
 - 3 STATUE OF LIBERTY FERRY.** Boats leave Battery Park on the hour daily 9-5. 80c, children 40c.
 - 4 STATEN ISLAND FERRY.** Half-hour ride across New York Bay (still only 5c) offers exciting skyline and harbor sight-seeing.
 - 5 FRAUNCES TAVERN.** Here George Washington bade farewell to his officers in 1783. Museum open Mon.-Fri. 10-4 all year; also Sat. 10-3 Sept.-June.
 - 6 NEW YORK STOCK EXCHANGE.** Visitors may watch trading in world's biggest securities market Mon.-Fri. 10-3:30.
 - 7 SUB-TREASURY BUILDING (Federal Hall Nat. Memorial).** Site of nation's first capitol where Washington was inaugurated 1789. Historical museum. Mon.-Fri. 9-4.
 - 8 TRINITY CHURCH (Episcopal).** Nearby is St. Paul's Chapel (Trinity Parish), oldest church in city, 1764.
 - 9 CITY HALL.** Historic building (1803) contains collection of portraits by American artists. Mon.-Fri. 10-4.
 - 10 CHINATOWN.** Flavor of the Orient in shops and restaurants along narrow, colorful streets. Chinatown Museum, 7 Mott St., depicts Chinese culture; open daily 10-10, 50c (60c week ends), children 40c.
 - 11 THE BOWERY.** Originally the road to Peter Stuyvesant's farm or "bouwerie"; later known as the "street of forgotten men." Here also is historic St. Mark's-in-the-Bouwerie Church (Episcopal).
 - 12 WASHINGTON SQUARE.** Fifth Avenue begins at white marble memorial arch in Greenwich Village.
 - 13 GREENWICH VILLAGE.** One of oldest and most interesting sections of city. Craft and gift shops; "off-Broadway" theaters; restaurants, tea and coffee shops; art shows.
 - 14 NEW YORK UNIVERSITY.**
 - 15 HUDSON RIVER DAY LINE.** Pier 81, W. 41st St. Daily trip up Hudson to Bear Mountain, West Point, Poughkeepsie, May 30 to Labor Day. Round trip \$4.50, children \$2.15. No stop at Poughkeepsie.
 - 16 CIRCLE LINE.** Pier 83, W. 43rd St. Several daily three-hour trips around Manhattan, early spring to late fall. \$2.50, children \$1.25.
 - 17 PENNSYLVANIA STATION.**
 - 18 GARMENT DISTRICT.**
 - 19 PORT AUTHORITY BUS TERMINAL.**
 - 20 WEST SIDE AIRLINES TERMINAL.**
 - 21 MADISON SQUARE GARDEN.** Arena for sports events, circus, political rallies, exhibits.
 - 22 TIMES SQUARE.** Manhattan's famed theater district extends north from here.
 - 23 MARBLE COLLEGIATE CHURCH (Reformed Church in America).**
 - 24 EMPIRE STATE BUILDING.** Observatories on 86th and 102nd floors of world's tallest building. Daily 9:30 a.m.-midnight. \$1.50, children 70c.
 - 25 ROCKEFELLER CENTER.** Tours daily 9:30-5:30 of "city within a city," \$1.75, children 95c. NBC television and radio tours daily 9-9, \$1.50, children 85c. RCA Building Observation Roof open daily 9 a.m.-midnight, \$1.15, children 65c. RCA Exhibition Hall, daily 11-8.
 - 26 ST. PATRICK'S CATHEDRAL (Roman Catholic).**
 - 27 MUSEUM OF MODERN ART.** Contemporary painting, photography, other arts. Weekdays 11-6 (to 9 Thurs.), Sun. 1-7. \$1, children 25c.
 - 28 FIFTH AVENUE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.**
 - 29 GRAND CENTRAL STATION.**
 - 30 COMMUNITY CHURCH OF NEW YORK (Unitarian).**
 - 31 EAST SIDE AIRLINES TERMINAL.**
 - 32 UNITED NATIONS.** One-hour guided tours daily 9-4:45. \$1, students 50c. Free tickets to meetings, first-come, first-served.
 - 33 LINCOLN CENTER FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS.** New York's new music, opera, drama, dance center. Designed to include Philharmonic Hall, home of Philharmonic Symphony Orchestra, Metropolitan Opera House, New York State Theater, Vivian Beaumont Theater, Library-Museum, Juilliard Building.
 - 34 HOLY TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH.**
 - 35 COLISEUM.** Modern office building and convention center can hold four expositions at same time.
 - 36 AMERICAN MUSEUM OF NATURAL HISTORY.** Hall of Man, American Indian exhibits, dinosaurs, life-like habitat groups included in vast collection. Weekdays 10-5, Sun. 1-5.
 - 37 HAYDEN PLANETARIUM.** "Sky" shows Mon.-Fri. at 2, 3:30, 8:30, (no Mon. 8:30 show); additional shows on week ends. \$1, children 50c; \$1.25 and 75c in evening.
 - 38 CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST OF LATTER-DAY SAINTS (Mormon).**
 - 39 FIRST CHURCH OF CHRIST SCIENTIST.**
 - 40 CHRIST CHURCH METHODIST.**
 - 41 CENTRAL PARK ZOO.** Lehman Children's Zoo and the seal pool are popular features. Daily 10-5.
 - 42 TEMPLE EMANU-EL.**
 - 43 METROPOLITAN MUSEUM OF ART.** One of great museums of the world. Exhibits trace 5,000 years of art. Weekdays 10-5, Sun. 1-5.
 - 44 GUGGENHEIM MUSEUM OF ART.** Unusual circular structure, designed by the late Frank Lloyd Wright, houses paintings, sculpture, graphic arts. Tues.-Sat. 10-6 (to 9 Thurs.), Sun. 12-6. 50c.
 - 45 MUSEUM OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK.** Traces city's growth from Dutch days to present. Tues.-Sat. 10-5, Sun. 1-5.
 - 46 CATHEDRAL OF ST. JOHN THE DIVINE (Episcopal).**
 - 47 COLUMBIA UNIVERSITY.**
 - 48 RIVERSIDE CHURCH (Interdenominational).**
 - 49 GRANT'S TOMB.** Granite memorial is burial place of President and Mrs. Ulysses S. Grant. Daily 9-5.
 - 50 COLLEGE OF CITY OF NEW YORK.**
 - 51 LEWISOHN STADIUM.**
 - 52 ABYSSINIAN BAPTIST CHURCH.**
 - 53 PORT AUTHORITY UPTOWN BUS TERMINAL.**
 - 54 THE CLOISTERS.** Medieval art museum atop hill high above Hudson. Tues.-Sat. 10-5, Sun. 1-5.
 - 55 FORDHAM UNIVERSITY.**
 - 56 N. Y. BOTANICAL GARDEN.** Trees, shrubs, flowers from around the world. Conservatory, Bronx River gorge. Daily 10-sunset.
 - 57 BRONX PARK ZOO.** Nation's largest collection of mammals, birds, reptiles. Daily 10-5.
 - 58 YANKEE STADIUM.**
 - 59 DOWNING AIRPORT.**
 - 60 LA GUARDIA AIRPORT.**
 - 61 MUNICIPAL STADIUM.**
 - 62 NEW YORK WORLD'S FAIR.**
